# **Pursuing Peace Amidst Polarization**

We conclude our services each Sunday morning by singing one of the verses of *tet* There Be Peace on Earth." In the first verse we note *'and let it begin with me.*" If this is our prayer in song, with us being an important part of the answer, how do we go about that?

On Worldwide Communion Sunday, October 6, 2024, we begin a new sermon series: "Pursuing Peace Amidst Polarization," in order to take *practical steps* to live out this aspect of what it means to follow Jesus, the Prince of Peace. I don't think anyone disagrees with the statement that we live in a polarized culture, but do our lives add to that polarization or move us toward peace?

We will explore such areas as:

- 1. What does it really mean to be a peacemaker (rather than just a peace lover) and how does that relate to our calling in Christ?
- 2. Why is it that important? Is it worth the time and effort it takes to move toward peace?
- 3. What are the character qualities necessary to be a fruitful peacemaker?
- 4. What is the pathway or process that can move us toward peace?

Our Theme verse for this series is: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." I encourage you to take time to meditate on this verse before we begin on October 6, 2024.

It promises to be a fascinating journey, one that can help us make a positive impact in our culture, whether it involves peacemaking at home, at church, at work, on social media, in our community, or throughout our country. Tune in each week either in person or via livestream!
