I realized I had never researched the origin of New Years Day, sort of a special day as it is also my birthday. Most of the special days we celebrate are only 100-400 years old. I figured New Years Day would fall into that category. I found myself a bit shocked to find the earliest known record of a New Year festival dates from about 2000 BCE in Mesopotamia, Babylonia, and in Assyria.

With the use of various calendars the day did not fall on January 1 until it was officially declared to be so in 153 BCE Though "official" the date moved around until it was restored to January 1 in 1582, by the Roman Catholic Church.

The practice of making resolutions to rid oneself of bad habits and to adopt better ones also dates to ancient times. Some believe the **Babylonians** began the custom more than 4,000 years ago. A baby was often the symbol of the New Year in various cultures beginning with the Greeks. I sense that our resolutions and hope for second chances from mistakes or poor choices in the old year have similarities to the sentiments of centuries past. My personal experience has been that the wonderful aspirations and good intentions don't exactly last very long, and the chance to start over at the beginning of the next year seems an eternity away.

I praise God that He is a God of second chances which on some occasions we need multiple ones in a single day. I am so thankful of His patience and love to enable me to wipe away a awful sin, and start anew. Yes, I enjoy New Years Day, but am indebted to the fresh starts made available ongoing. How about you? May God's very best be yours in 2025!
