September 2024 Fall Kickoff?

Many, if not most of those currently attending WPC or remain supporters of its ministry (even if they are no longer are able to attend) remember huge fall celebrations to kick off another season of Sunday School, mid-week programs and other ministries that largely followed the school year calendar. We know that for a host of reasons spiritual life in America has radically changed, and this is not where we and a large% of churches in the US are at in the current season of life as a congregation.

Perhaps the greatest lament is the lack of children and youth. We are blessed with the three youth who are still actively involved in worship at WPC, but obviously miss the sounds of babies and toddlers in the nursery, and the pitter-patter of small feet down the hallways. This, however, does not mean that WPC is not impacting young lives for the Kingdom of God. Consider the following **eleven areas**:

1. This summer, we were able to sponsor five children from Wellington Heights Community Church to go to Bear Creek Camp (formerly Camp Wyoming). Many experienced a church camp for the very first time. This congregation is large made up of those who are in the lower income brackets. Here are a couple of notes we received:

2. At Loaves and Fishes, we impact each week some 385 family members, providing essential nourishment to people and other supplies to our surrounding neighborhoods.

3. This summer we, through the *Grillin' Wednesdays*, were able to interact with many individuals, including children/youth, and showed them that they matter to us.

4. We were also able to help youth prepare for School in partnering with Beacon of Life (BOL) with the Back-to-School Giveaway.

5. We are into our second month of hosting a youth group (essentially a Bible Hour as this model does not include kids running around playing games). Each Monday evening from 7-8pm around 5-6 adults from Gospel Hall Church in Marion share the gospel in creative ways and spend significant time helping kids memorize scripture in our Atrium.
20-30 youth from the Wellington Heights neighborhood are involved. They have been doing this for nearly 8 years, but the house they were using from the Neighborhood Association ended up being sold, making it necessary to find a new location.

6. On Thursday evenings (yet to begin for this fall), Beacon of Light offers another youth group that largely meets a different segment of the Wellington Heights Neighborhood.

7. By also hosting the Evangelical Global Pentecostal Church (EGPC), we are impacting yet another segment of youth in Cedar Rapids. Because their music ministry has been so effective, other African congregations are asking if they can send their youth to EGPC's music program.

8. While the English as a Second Language (ESL) class was recently started on Saturdays here to help Adults primarily from the EGPC. It has the potential of hugely impacting children/youth as learning English will open opportunities such as working, driving, and feeling more adjusted to a very different culture than they are used to.

9. Right now session is assessing a facility request to use the upper level of our facility to begin a Classic Christian Micro School. (None of us had a clue in the beginning of what this really was). More will come later depending on how this may unfold.

10. On September 15, 2024 we will once again have a balloon launch to celebrate all of these and see whose balloon travels the farthest.

11. This fall on Friday, November 15, 2024, we again are planning to offer a Community Dinner as we did last year, impacting adults and youth from a wide variety of backgrounds.
